Our History & Our Place in the Story

Chanel College was established in 1966 to serve the youth of Gladstone district for their secondary schooling. The opening year saw an enrolment of twenty-three boys and girls in Year 8. They were accommodated on the site of the Star of the Sea Church and School at the corner of Goondoon and Herbert Streets.

The following year, 1967, saw the College move to its present site. Stella Maris College was established to become the girls' section of the Catholic High School under the guidance of the Sisters of Mercy. The classes were co-educational.

With the arrival of the first
Marist Brothers in 1968, Chanel
College was founded as the
boys' section of the Catholic
High School. As time went on,
both schools amalgamated
under the name of Gladstone
Catholic High School. In 1985,
Saint Peter Chanel was officially
adopted as Patron of the
College which then took the
name of Chanel College.

classrooms, specialist rooms and staff amenities were built. By 1978, the number of students enrolled had reached three hundred and five. The Senior College was established in 1982 with forty-one students in this first year. Enrolments have continued to grow each year since, with the college population reaching over six hundred in 1990. In 1988, extra classrooms and a new library were built and 1992 saw the construction of a new Administration Block. The old Administration Block was converted to a Business **Education and Computer Centre** in 1993. The Marist Brothers withdrew from the College at the end of 1993 and the Mercy Sisters withdrew from the College in 1994. Sr Maria Goretti was the last Mercy Sister at Chanel. She worked as a counsellor / support person for the students. In 2005, Mercy Sister, Sr Beryl Amadee, reconnected with the College in a role that involved mentoring teachers.

In 1974 and 1978 additional

1997 saw the completion of two additional facilities – the new Manual Arts Centre and the Marian Centre. The Marian Centre is used for Physical Education classes, College assemblies and some Masses. In recent years the computer

facilities have been expanded and updated.

In 2014, members of the College community were invited to participate in a Charrette – a formal process of consultation about the future development of the College. The outcome of this process saw the building of a new Administration Centre and the refurbishing of specialist facilities. These included an Industrial & Design Technology Precinct, an Arts Precinct, Student Services & Inclusive Curriculum Precincts and the development of a state of the art Performing Arts Centre. These new and refurbished facilities were officially blessed in 2017.

With increased enrolments and a student population of 840 in 2023, the College has once again embarked on a building program. Demountable classrooms and a new block housing GLA's, FLA's, specialist areas, offices, amenities, covered areas, lift facility, and a new canteen (Café Chanel), have provided additional space for instruction and other activities. Planning is underway for the construction of a new, contemporary library/resource/ innovation centre.

Our Future

Working towards achieving the goals of successive Strategic Plans ensures that Chanel College continues to prioritise the provision of an excellent and holistic education within a context that values the unique giftedness of each young person within an environment that is aesthetically conducive to learning. We are committed to inspiring the spirits and minds of all in our community to look to the future with hope.

The implementation of this 2024 - 2027 Strategic Plan marks the consolidation of what has been an exciting period of growth and development for Chanel College. We look forward to continuing to share this journey with our wider community: past, present, and future.
